### IOWA'S TOP YOUTH VOLUNTEERS OF 2017 SELECTED BY NATIONAL PROGRAM

The Prudential Spirit of Community Awards honors Aurora and Emmetsburg students with \$1,000, medallions and trip to nation's capital

Finalists also named in Burlington, Cedar Falls, Red Oak and Long Grove

DES MOINES, Iowa – Jennifer Jenks, 17, of Aurora and Aliza Woodford, 13, of Emmetsburg today were named Iowa's top two youth volunteers of 2017 by The Prudential Spirit of Community Awards, a nationwide program honoring young people for outstanding acts of volunteerism. As State Honorees, Jennifer and Aliza each will receive \$1,000, an engraved silver medallion and an all-expense-paid trip in early May to Washington, D.C., where they will join the top two honorees from each of the other states and the District of Columbia for four days of national recognition events. During the trip, 10 students will be named America's top youth volunteers of 2017.

"After volunteering in Mercy Medical Center's gift shop for an extended period, I witnessed the debilitating effects of mental and degenerative ailments on individuals and their loved ones," said Jennifer. president of her National Honor Society, Courtney has spent hundreds of hours working on ideas and activities to make a lasting positive impact on her school.

Sydney Conrad, 17, of Cedar Falls, Iowa, a junior at Janesville Junior-Senior High School, has spent many hours providing company and household help to a woman with multiple sclerosis, lending a hand with tasks ranging from yardwork to organizing the garage. Sydney, who connected with the woman through mutual acquaintances, has benefited from the life advice she's shared and plans to continue volunteering with her in the future.

Sean Griffen, 17, of Red Oak, Iowa, a senior at Red Oak High School, led an effort to replace and upgrade the trail signs at Viking Lake State Park, helping visitors navigate 5.83 miles of trail with 56 new, user-friendly signs. After noticing how often runners got lost in the park during cross-country practice, Sean gained plan approval from the park and donations from the community, gathered each component, then hosted several work days where 45 volunteers helped to assemble the signs.

Molly McCunn, 17, of Long Grove, Iowa, a senior at North Scott Senior High School, coordinated an engineering workshop for kids at her local library to increase their interest in the field and inspire them to take advantage of the engineering classes available to them in high school. Molly drew nearly 100 young participants to her event, which featured stations focused on different disciplines of engineering and a local aerospace engineer making water rockets.

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### CONTRACT FOR THE PURCHASE OF SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 9th day of March, 2017, between the SCHOOL DISTRICT of Red Oak IN THE COUNTY OF Mills In THE STATE OF Iowa hereinafter referred to as the SCHOOL DISTRICT and ALPHA SCHOOL (EASTERN NEBRASKA HUMAN SERVICES AGENCY), 900 South 74th Plaza, Omaha, Nebraska 68114-4675, hereinafter referred to as the SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICE AGENCY.

### WHEREAS:

- A. SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES AGENCY has been approved as a "SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICE AGENCY" by the Nebraska Department of Education, NDE Agency Code 950441- Service Code 4019, has the capability of providing the program of special education or related services described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated fully by reference herein.
- B. The student(s) herein after "the student" listed in Exhibit "B" attached hereto and incorporated fully by reference herein, are the responsibility of the SCHOOL DISTRICT, and have been determined to be eligible for the type of special education services to be provided by SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICE AGENCY.

### IT IS, THEREFORE, AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The term of this agreement shall be from March 9, 2017 to May 26, 2017, during which period SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES AGENCY agrees to provide special education services described in Exhibit "A" to the students listed on Exhibit "B". SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES AGENCY further agrees to evaluate and measure the educational progress of the students and to report such progress to the SCHOOL DISTRICT from time to time in such a manner as the SCHOOL DISTRICT may request.
- 2. The SCHOOL DISTRICT agrees to pay SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES AGENCY \$159.00 per day of membership to each student under this agreement as indicated in Exhibit "B".
- 3. SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES AGENCY shall submit statements for services rendered under this agreement not less frequently than monthly. The SCHOOL DISTRICT agrees to remit the amounts shown due on such statements within thirty (30) days of the receipt of such statement.

- 4. The parties agree that except for the initial determination of the student's eligibility for services, at all times this agreement and all aspects of the relationship between the parties related thereto shall be governed solely by Nebraska law.
- 5. This contract is terminable by either party upon thirty (30) days written notice delivered to the respective parties' mutual places of business. The requirement may be waived upon written agreement of the parties. When a student poses a significant danger to other students or staff, the SPECIAL EDUCAION SERVICES AGENCY may terminate services immediately and notify respective parties.

THIS AGREEMENT shall be binding upon the parties and their successors in authority.

The primary purpose of Alpha School is to provide educational instruction in traditional and nontraditional areas of academic subjects in a highly structured and therapeutically integrated environment. The overall goal is to reintegrate the student back into a more traditional education setting offered by his/her referring school district. This goal is accomplished through a therapeutic educational approach designed specifically for each child or youth. The therapeutic educational approach includes a planned and progressive reintegration phase for return of the student to the public school setting. During the reintegration phase the student is considered to be a full time student at Alpha School. They are involved in the public school setting for progressively lengthening school days until a determination is made to return the student to the public school setting on a full time basis. When this determination is made the student will be terminated from services by Alpha School. The following represent area of focus:

- 1. Academic Achievement
- 2. Behavioral and Cognitive-Behavioral
- 3. Emotional
- 4. Socialization
- 5. Personal Growth Skills and Daily Living Skills
- 6. Supportive Mental Health
- 7. Family/Caretaker Supports
- 8. Technical Training
- 9. Planned and Progressive Reintegration to a Public School Setting

The Alpha School serves students between the ages of five (5) and twenty-one (21) years. The student to staff ratio is 6-1.

Total contract cost is \$159.00 per day for each of the 50 days of membership in the day treatment program.


