All polling places are handicapped accessible, however, any voter who is physically unable to enter a polling place has the right to vote in the voter's vehicle. Please contact the Page County Auditor's Office at 712-542-3219.

Pre-registered voters are required to provide an approved form of identification at the polling place before receiving and casting a regular ballot. Voters who are not pre-registered - such as voters registering to vote on election day - and voters changing precincts must also provide proof of residence. A voter who is unable to provide an approved form of identification (or prove residence if required) 1) may have the voter's identity/residence attested to by another registered voter in the precinct, 2) prove identity and residence using Election Day Registration documents, or 3) cast a provisional ballot and provide proof of identity/residence at the county auditor's office by Thursday, November 4, 2021 at noon. Election Day Registrant attestors must provide an approved form of identification.
